Nonprofit Westchester recently announced the Ronald McDonald House of the greater Hudson Valley as its newest member.

Its staff and volunteers provide comfort and support to families during the most difficult time of their lives.

NPW provides the nonprofit sector with a single unified voice for the role it plays in the economic vitality and sustainability of the county. The organization focuses on sharing resources, connections and information, and works to strengthen the nonprofit sector’s partnership with the for-profit and government sectors for a more just and caring community.
