Organization

Clay Art Center is a nationally recognized 501(c)(3) non-profit ceramic arts center and is the largest and most active ceramic facility in the tri-state area. Located in Port Chester, NY, less than 30 miles to New York City, it is the only arts institution in a diverse community with an appreciation for Clay Art Center's contribution of providing access to the arts. Occupying 11,000 sq. ft. in two adjacent buildings, it is an artistic community and an educational center where professional artists mingle and mentor emerging artists and students.

Founded in 1957, Clay Art Center was originally privately owned by two artists, Katherine Choy & Henry Okamoto, whose vision was to create a center that provided ceramic artists a community environment to create, innovate and invigorate their practice. There have been several changes of ownership over the years and in 1997 Reena Kashyap became the new owner. Her vision to change the official structure and to incorporate Clay Art Center as a non-profit organization became a reality in 2006. Kashyap has worked tirelessly to ensure programmatic excellence by initiating the resident artists program and successfully expanding the education, community arts and exhibition programs. In 2013, when Clay Art Center reached financial stability, Kashyap stepped aside from management and the first paid executive director was hired. To this day, Kashyap continues to lend her voice, historical knowledge and expertise to Clay Art Center as a Board Member.

Overview of the Position

Reporting to the Board of Directors, the Executive Director will lead Clay Art Center into its next chapter. Working closely with the Board and staff, the Executive Director will guide a strategic planning process, securing a facility in which to carry out the goals of that plan. This will identify a clear vision embraced by all stakeholders.

With aspiration to evolve and thrive as a ceramic arts institution, Clay Art Center is seeking a collaborative, yet strategic leader who has a combination of talents including coordinating

viewpoints in thoughtful ways, consensus building, and finding common ground for the many stakeholders.

The candidate must have a nonprofit background and be knowledgeable of ceramics and arts education. They must also have sound financial management experience and demonstrated experience in leading an organization at this stage of its existence.

Operations and Facilities

- Assess current capacity needs of facility and design a suitable strategy for future needs
- Oversee sound financial management for all departments: develop organizational project budgets, ensure accurate and timely financial reporting and grant compliance, develop investment strategies, and complete annual audits
- Assess programs to determine any necessary improvements
- Formulate and implement outcome measurement tools and apply and evaluate periodically

The Board is committed to staying true to the rich history of Clay Art Center, its dedication to supporting ceramic artists, and hiring a new leader who will partner with them on this journey. Therefore, the incoming Executive Director will be a strong impactful leader, who is passionate about ceramics and arts education and who ensures a welcoming and hospitable environment for all stakeholders.
