## About DeLauné Michel

Raised in a South Louisiana literary family that includes her first cousin André Dubus III, and second cousin James Lee Burke, Ms. Michel has spent over two decades in the literary world – producing an acclaimed reading series, empowering marginalized voices, and writing fiction and nonfiction. Her career telling stories began with her work as an actor in theatre (including her critically-acclaimed one-woman show), television (including *NYPD Blue*), and feature films (including Harry Shearer’s directorial debut). In 1996, Ms. Michel created the critically-acclaimed reading series, *Spoken Interludes*, to sold-out audiences. Ms. Michel then developed, taught in, and continues to run outreach writing programs for at-risk youth in inner-city schools, juvenile institutions, and prison reaching over 450 children a year in New York and Los Angeles since 2000. Through *Spoken Interludes*, she also runs a book-drive, putting over 6,000 free books into the hands of underprivileged children. The first two short stories Ms. Michel wrote won recognition in the Thomas Wolf Short Fiction Competition. Her novels, *Aftermath of Dreaming* and *The Safety of Secrets*, were published by HarperCollins. After completing a third novel, she is currently working on a memoir.
